1. Indian Air Force invites ONLINE applications from MALE INDIAN/ GORKHA (A SUBJECT OF NEPAL) citizens from all States and UTs for selection test from 25 September 2025 onwards to join Indian Air Force as Airmen in the Group 'Y' Medical Assistant trade.

(THE SELECTION TEST IS NOT FOR SELECTION AS COMMISSIONED OFFICERS/ PILOTS/ NAVIGATORS/ AGNIVEERVAYU)

- 2. Application is required to be filled only ONLINE by the candidates and detailed instructions to fill up the same are available at www.airmenselection.cdac.in.
- 3. This examination is valid for AIRMEN INTAKE 02/2026
- 4. ONLINE REGISTRATION shall commence at 1100 Hr on 11 July 2025 and will close at 2300 Hr on 31 July 2025. Only ONLINE REGISTERED applications shall be accepted. For registration log on to www.airmenselection.cdac.in.
 - Note. Candidates are advised to register at the earliest opportunity as no extension of registration dates will be accommodated.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

5. Marital Status and Date of Birth Block.

- 5.1. **Medical Assistant trade (For candidates with 10+2)**. Candidate should be unmarried and born between **02 July 2005** and **02 July 2009** (both dates inclusive).
- 5.2. Medical Assistant trade (For candidates with Diploma/ B.Sc in Pharmacy). Unmarried candidate should be born between 02 July 2002 and 02 July 2007 (both dates inclusive). Married candidate should be born between 02 July 2002 and 02 July 2005 (both dates inclusive).
- 5.3. In case, a candidate clear all the stages of the Selection Procedure, then the upper age limit as on date of enrolment should be 21 years for candidates with 10+2/ Intermediate/ Equivalent including vocational course and 24 Years for candidates holding Diploma/ B.Sc in Pharmacy.

6. Educational Qualification

6.1. Candidate should have passed 10+2/ Intermediate/ Equivalent Examination with Physics, Chemistry, Biology and English from Education Boards recognised by Central, State and UT with a minimum of 50% marks in aggregate and with 50% marks in English.

OR

Should have passed two years' Vocational Course with non-vocational subjects i.e. Physics, Chemistry, Biology and English from Education Boards recognised by Central, State and UT with minimum 50% marks in aggregate and 50% marks in English.

6.2. **Candidate with Diploma/ B.Sc in Pharmacy**. Candidate should have passed Intermediate/ 10+2/ Equivalent Examination with Physics, Chemistry, Biology and English with a minimum of 50% marks in aggregate and 50% marks in English. In addition, Diploma/ B.Sc in Pharmacy with minimum 50% marks in aggregate with valid registration from State Pharmacy Council or Pharmacy Council of India (PCI) at the time of enrolment will be mandatory requirement.

Note-1. Education Boards (for 10+2 or equivalent) recognised by Central, State and UT shall only be permitted.

Note-2. Exact aggregate percentage of marks before decimal as written in the marks sheet of 10+2/ Intermediate/ Equivalent/ Diploma/ B.Sc in Pharmacy OR calculated as per the rules of concerned Education Board shall only be considered (For example 49.99% should be taken as 49% and not to be rounded off to 50%).

- 7. Mandatory Medical Standards. General Physical/ Medical Standards to become an Airmen are as follows:
 - 7.1. Weight. Weight should be proportionate to height and age as applicable for IAF
 - 7.2. **Chest**. Minimum chest circumference should be 77 cm and chest expansion must be at least 05 cm.
 - 7.3. **Hearing**. Candidate should have normal hearing i.e. able to hear forced whisper from a distance of 6 meters by each ear separately.
 - 7.4. **Dental**. Should have healthy gums, good set of teeth and minimum 14 dental points.
 - 7.5. **General Health**. Candidates should be fit for the Air Force, must conform to the medical standards. Candidates should be of normal anatomy without loss or deformity of any appendages. He should be free from any active or latent, acute or chronic, medical or surgical disability or communicable disease, infection and skin ailments. Candidate shall be physically and mentally FIT to perform duty in any part of the world, in any climate and terrain.
 - 7.6. **Gender**. Any candidate if found to have predominant characteristics of the opposite gender as evident on external physical examination, will be rejected as **Unfit**. Any candidate having undergone gender reassignment surgery will be declared **Unfit**.
 - 7.7. Height & Visual Standards. Visual standards and minimum acceptable height for Medical Assistant and Medical Assistant (Pharmacist) for recruitment are as follows:-

Note

- 7.7.1. Candidates should bring latest prescription (not older than one month) and spectacles for corrected vision, if used. The prescription must bear the diopter measurement, name, signature, stamp and registration number of Ophthalmologist. Date of prescription should be within a month prior to appearing for medical examination.
- 7.7.2. Candidates with history of LASIK/ PRK will not be accepted.
- 7.8. Details of medical standards are available on CASB web portal www.airmenselection.cdac.in.
- 8. Consumption of Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substance (NDPS). Consumption of Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic substances banned under the NDPS Act 1985 shall be a reject criteria for selection into the IAF. Airmen found either in possession or storing or distributing or consuming such drugs and substances after enrolment shall be liable for disciplinary action including dismissal from the IAF. ZERO TOLERANCE POLICY TO ALCOHOLISM AND SUBSTANCE ABUSE IS FOLLOWED IN IAF
- 9. **Body Tattoo**. Permanent body tattoos are not permitted. However, tattoos only on inner face of the fore arms (inside of elbow to the wrist), back (dorsal) part of the hand/ reverse side of palm and Tribal with tattoos which are as per custom and traditions of their tribes may be considered. Offensive, obscene, indecent, sexist or racist tattoos are prohibited regardless of location on the body. However, right to consider a tattoo acceptable or unacceptable will rest with the Selection Centre. Candidates with permanent body tattoos are to submit two postcard size photographs (close up and distant view) with details of size and type of the Tattoo.
- 10. **Only Sikh candidates**, whose religion prohibits cutting of hair or shaving of face, shall be permitted to grow hair and/ or retain beard and moustache. Accordingly, those Sikh candidates willing to retain the same as per laid down specification are to get their photographs with beard and moustache.
- 11. Candidates discharged from Indian Army/ Indian Navy/ any other Government Organisation shall also be eligible subject to their discharge with NO ADVERSE ENTRIES. Such candidate has to declare at the time of testing for Phase-II that he is an Ex-employee of above said organisations and produce original Discharge Certificate. In case of serving individuals, they must be in possession of NOC from their employer at the time of Phase-II. If any candidate does not disclose the fact of being employed or that of being an Ex-employee, his candidature shall be cancelled at any stage during the selection process and if selected, shall be liable for discharge/ dismissal from the service for hiding the fact of his employment. Candidates discharged from the Indian Air Force for any reason are not eligible to appear in the selection test. Candidates debarred permanently from any previous Air Force exam due to malpractices or any unfair activity are not eligible to appear in the selection test. If found at a later stage, the candidature will be cancelled automatically.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- 12. **Tenure & Training.** Enrolment shall be for an initial period of 20 years (subject to service conditions) which may be extended up to the age of 57 years (subject to service conditions). Initially, candidates shall be sent for a Joint Basic Phase Training (JBPT) at designated Basic Training Institute. On successful completion of JBPT, candidates will be sent for trade training of specific duration which shall include security training or any other training as per service requirements. Training is however liable to be terminated at any time if the trainee fails to achieve the required standards in academics, profession, physical fitness and discipline or is found to be medically unfit. **AFTER SUCCESSFUL COMPLETION OF ALL STAGES OF TRAINING, THE AIRMEN SHALL BE DEPLOYED ON JOBS AS PER IAF REQUIREMENTS. TRADE ALLOTTED SHALL NOT BE CHANGED ON CANDIDATE'S REQUEST ON ANY GROUNDS.**
 - Note-1. Candidates will not be permitted to stay with their family during the training period.
 - Note-2. Unmarried candidates will not be permitted to get married till successful completion of their ab-initio training
- 13. **Employability**. Airmen enrolled under this entry are liable to be assigned any duty in organisational interest at the discretion of the Indian Air Force.
- 14. **Pay & Allowances**. During training, a stipend of ₹14,600/- per month shall be paid. On completion of training the starting gross emoluments at the minimum of scale of pay including Military Service Pay (MSP) is ₹26,900/- per month. In addition, dearness allowances (as applicable) which, in subsequent years, may rise as per the career progression of the individual.
- 15. Other allowances such as Transport Allowance, Composite Person Maintenance Allowance (CPMA), Leave Ration Allowance (LRA), Children Education Allowance, HRA etc. shall also be admissible to Airmen, as per relevant government instructions.
- 16. **Higher Education**. Airmen shall be permitted to pursue higher education qualification only after acquiring prescribed skill grade in their trade and prescribed years of service as stated in HRP (Human Resource Policy).
- 17. **Perks**. Perks such as ration, clothing, medical facilities, accommodation, CSD facilities, Leave (60 days annual and 30 days casual in a calendar year as a privilege, subject to service exigencies), Recreational facilities, transport for school going children and Leave Travel Concession (LTC) shall also be provided as per the existing rules. Group Insurance Cover of ₹62.5 Lakhs at a premium of ₹3200/- per month for all Airmen and facility of Group Housing Scheme are also extended.
- 18. **Job Specification of Medical Assistant Trade**. As a Medical Assistant, you are to be trained in nursing and first-aid. You will also be involved in management of medical stores, dispensaries and ward supervision and other Air Force duties.
 - Note. Airmen shall also have to undertake any other tasks as assigned by superior authorities.

SEQUENCE OF EXAMINATION

MOBILE PHONES/ SMART WATCHES/ ELECTRONIC DEVICES ARE PROHIBITED IN TESTING AREAS DURING PHASE-I AND PHASE-II. CANDIDATES FOUND IN POSSESSION OF MOBILE PHONES/ ELECTRONIC DEVICES SHALL BE DEBARRED PERMANENTLY

Phase - I

- 19. **Online Test**. Eligible candidates will be sent admit cards for Phase I of testing on their registered **e-mail IDs** between 48-72 Hr prior to the examination. Candidates are required to download the admit card, take a colour printout and carry the same to the examination centre. Name of city & exam date will be intimated to the candidates at an earlier date to enable them to plan their movement. This provisional admit card can also be downloaded by the candidate under candidates login on CASB web portal www.airmenselection.cdac.in. All candidates in possession of provisional admit card will undertake Online Test at centres designated/ allotted as per their admit card. Online test will be objective type and questions will be bilingual (English & Hindi) except for English paper. Candidates are to bring one blue/ black pen and original **AADHAAR card** along with them for Phase I testing. Details of the test are as follows:-
 - 19.1. Duration of online test will be 45 minutes and shall comprise English as per 10+2 CBSE syllabus and Reasoning & General Awareness (RAGA).
 - 19.2. Marking Pattern for Online Test (Objective).
 - 19.2.1. One mark for every correct answer.
 - 19.2.2. Nil (0) mark for un-attempted question.
 - 19.2.3. 0.25 marks shall be deducted for each wrong answer.
 - **Note**. Above examination methodology has been designed to facilitate selection process based on qualifications of candidates. Irrespective of the examination methodology Airmen enrolled under this entry are liable to be assigned any duty in organisational interest, at the discretion of the Indian Air Force.
- 20. If required, marks scored by the candidates in STAR Phase-I testing will be "Normalised" by using the formula as published on the website www.airmenselection.cdac.in, to take into account variation in difficulty levels of the question papers across different sessions. Candidates are to note that the application of Cut-Off for shortlisting of candidates for STAR Phase-II testing and preparation of Final Merit List for selection will be based on "Normalised Marks" and not on the "Actual Marks" scored by the candidate in STAR Phase-I testing if normalisation is applied. Further, if normalisation is applied, marks scored by a candidate in a subject may become less/ more than actual marks and in exceptional cases, it may be more than the total marks of that subject.
- 21. CANDIDATES ARE TO QUALIFY IN EACH PAPER SEPARATELY, with normalised marks if normalisation is applied. The result of Phase-I and shortlisting for Phase-II, based on their performance in Phase-I online test, will be uploaded in candidate's individual log in ID on wave discrepance and a log in ID.

Phase - II

- 22. Soon after the declaration of the result of Phase-I (Online) Test, a cut off will be applied on the normalised marks scored by the candidates in the Phase-I Test if normalisation is applied and SHORTLISTED candidates will be sent a **new Admit Card** on their registered **e-mail IDs** for Phase-II test at a designated ASC. This Admit Card for Phase-II exam can also be downloaded online under candidate's login on CASB web portal www.airmenselection.cdac.in. Candidates have to report on the stipulated date and time for Phase-II at the designated ASC along with following:-
 - 22.1. Colour print out of Phase-II Admit Card.
 - 22.2. Colour print out of duly filled application form downloaded on completion of online registration.
 - 22.3. HB pencil, eraser, sharpener, glue stick, stapler and black/ blue ball point pen for writing.
 - 22.4. Eight copies of un-attested passport size color photograph (which was used for the online application registration).
 - 22.5. Original and four self-attested photocopies of matriculation passing certificate (required for verification of candidate's name, father's name and his date of birth).
 - 22.6. Original and four self-attested photocopies of 10+2/ Intermediate/ XII or equivalent/ vocational examination passing certificate and marks sheet.
 - 22.7. Original and four self-attested photocopies of passing certificate and mark sheet of B.Sc/ Diploma in Pharmacy, if applicable.
 - 22.8. Certificate of SOAFP (Son of Air Force Personnel), including certificate for Son of serving/ retired/ deceased Air Force civilian employee paid out of defence estimates are to be downloaded as the case may be, from the download section of CASB web portal and brought along while reporting for Phase-II of the examination.
 - 22.9. Original Phase-I Admit Card used during Phase-I test bearing Air Force seal and invigilator's signature.
 - 22.10. Body tattoo photographs as per Para 9 above.
 - 22.11. Original and four self-attested photocopies of NCC 'A', 'B' or 'C' certificate (if applicable).
 - 22.12. NOC in original and four self-attested photocopies from the employer for candidates presently serving in any government organisation (if applicable).

- Candidates discharged from Indian Army/ Indian Navy/ Any other Government Organisation. Original and four self-attested photocopies of Discharge Certificate (as issued from Indian Army/ Indian Navy/ Government Organisation).
- Note. Original NCC certificate must have serial No., round seal of issuing authority and stamp of signing authority. Photo affixed on the certificate must have been attested by issuing authority with stamp.
- Verification of Eligibility. Candidates should be in possession of the documents mentioned at para 22 above, when appearing for the selection test which would be scrutinised/ verified prior to commencement of Phase-II to ascertain the eligibility prima-facie. Detailed verification of all the documents listed at para 22 above shall be carried out in respect of candidates who pass Physical Fitness Test. Candidature of those who do not meet the laid down educational criteria shall be cancelled during initial verification of original certificates & mark sheets and also during detailed verification at ASC.
 - Note-1. In the case of SOAFP, the name of the candidate, parent's name and the date of birth of the candidate as mentioned in the discharge book/ service book/ service particular certificate / casualty certificate (as applicable) must be the same as mentioned in the matriculation passing certificate of the candidate
 - Note-2. Under no circumstances, the candidates shall be permitted to appear in Phase-II of the selection test without original educational marks sheets/ passing certificates & documents mentioned above in paragraph 22. However, candidates with photocopies of educational marks sheets/ passing certificates may be permitted to appear in the selection test only on production of a certificate from college/ school Principal certifying that educational certificates/ marks sheets are deposited with college/ school. In exceptional circumstances, DigiLocker verified certificates will be accepted and candidates will be issued with CSV (Certificate Subject to Verification) status. Candidates are thereafter required to submit original certificates to nearest ASC within one month from date of issue of CSV, to clear the CSV status.
 - Note-3. The original passing certificates/ marks sheet shall not be retained by the selection centre. The same shall be returned to the candidates on completion of detailed verification.
 - Internet copy of marks sheet is not acceptable. Note-4.
 - The printout of educational certificates obtained from mobile snapshot/ photo image will not be accepted. Candidates are to bring legible photocopies of educational certificates for verification.
 - Note-6. Candidates are strictly prohibited from doing any rough work or write anything anywhere on the Admit Cards issued for Phase-I and Phase-II. Such candidates will be DEBARRED PERMANENTLY.
- Physical Fitness Test (PFT). Names of the shortlisted candidates, who qualify the online test, shall be displayed on the CASB Web Portal www.airmenselction.cdac.in and on a stipulated date shall be called at designated ASC for Physical Fitness Test (PFT) and Adaptability Test I & II. PFT consist of two parts i.e. PFT-I & PFT-II.
 - PFT-I Candidates have to complete 1.6 Kms run as per the following timing to gualify PFT-I:-

- Note: Candidates are advised to bring their sports shoes and shorts/ track pants. Detailed procedure on expected technique for Push-ups, Sit-ups and Squats is available on CASB Web Portal www.airmenselection.cdac.in
- Candidates shall sign a consent form prior to appearing in physical fitness test/ medical test for selection in IAF. He shall appear in these tests at his own risk and shall not be paid any compensation by IAF for injury/ casualty if any, sustained by him during such tests. The consent form shall be signed by parents/ guardian of candidates below 18 years of age. The consent form would be appended with Phase-II admit card.
- Adaptability Test-I. All candidates who pass the Physical Fitness Test (PFT) shall have to undertake Adaptability Test-I (objective type written test) which is to assess suitability of a candidate for employment in the IAF which involves deployment in varied geographic terrain, weather and operational conditions.
- Adaptability Test-II. All candidates who pass Adaptability Test-I will have to undertake Adaptability Test-II as per policy in vogue. Adaptability Test-II is to select candidates who can adapt to the environment of the Indian Air Force and are able to adjust to the military way of life.

Phase - III

- Medical Examination. Candidates who qualify Adaptability Test-II shall be issued with medical appointment letter by respective ASCs. Medical examination shall be conducted by Air Force Medical Team as per Indian Air Force medical standards in IAF Publication and policy in vogue on subject issue. Medical examination would also include Baseline Investigations of:-
 - 28.1. Blood Haemogram Hb, TLC, DLC & Platelets.
 - 28.2. Urine RE/ME.
 - 28.3. Biochemistry
 - 28.3.1. Blood Sugar Fasting & Post Prandial. 28.3.2. Serum Cholesterol.
 - 28.3.3. RFT Serum Urea, Uric acid & Creatinine.
 - 28.3.4. LFT Serum Bilirubin, SGOT, SGPT.
 - 28.4. Radiograph chest (PA view)
 - 28.5. ECG (R).
 - 28.6. Any other investigation deemed necessary by the Recruiting Medical Officer.
- Candidates declared medically unfit can avail the option for 'Appeal Medical Board' (AMB) against their unfitness by depositing ₹ 40/- in a Government Treasury/ RBI/ SBI through Electronic Military Receivable Order (e-MRO)/ Military Receivable Order (MRO). The application for AMB along with original copy of e-MRO/ MRO, photocopy of Unfitness Certificate are to be submitted to the representative of ASC within three working days of medical examination.
- The Recruitment Medical Officer and the specialist doctors of Armed Forces are the final authorities on declaring a candidate Fit or Unfit during Initial Medical Examination, Appeal Medical Board and Medical Examination prior to Enrolment.
- The candidates shall be governed by Armed Force Medical standards which may be at variance from civil standards. There is no provision for
 - Note-1. Candidates are advised to get tartar and stains removed from their teeth before appearing for the medical examination. Ears should be free of wax. Candidates should be prepared to stay for the medical examination for four to five days under their own arrangement. No TA/ DA shall be admissible.
 - Note-2. Passing in the medical examination is not a guarantee for employment in Indian Air Force.
 - Note-3. Request for change of Medical Examination Centre or Date of Medical Examination shall not be entertained

HOW TO APPLY

- Candidates are to fill ONLINE Applications by logging on to www.airmenselection.cdac.in.
- During online registration, the following documents are to be uploaded as applicable by respective candidates:-33.
 - 33.1. Class 10th/ matriculation passing certificate.
 - 33.2. Intermediate/ 10+2/ Equivalent Examination marks sheet with Physics, Chemistry, Biology and English from Education Boards recognised by Central, State and UT with a minimum of 50% marks in aggregate and with 50% marks in English.

- Two years vocational Course marks sheets of non-vocational subject i.e. Physics, Chemistry, Biology and English from Education Board recognised by Central, State and UT with minimum 50% marks in aggregate and with 50% marks in English.
- Candidate with Diploma/ B.Sc in Pharmacy. Mark sheet of Diploma/ B.Sc in Pharmacy with minimum of 50% marks in aggregate
- Passport size recent colour photograph (taken not before June 2025) of size 10 KB to 100 KB (front portrait in light background without facemask and head gear except for Sikhs). The photographs is to be taken with candidate holding a black slate in front of his chest with his name and date of photograph taken, clearly written on it with white chalk in capital letters. Change in appearance like growing beard, head gear etc., in comparison to the photographs may result in cancellation of candidature for STAR online examination and Phase-II.
- 33.5. Candidate's left hand thumb impression image (Size 10 KB to 100 KB).
- 33.6. Candidate's signature image (Size 10 KB to 100 KB).
- 33.7. Candidate's parent's (Father/ Mother)/ Guardian's signature image (if candidate is below 18 years on the date of filling the online application).
- 34. Examination Fee. Examination fee of ₹ 550/- plus GST is to be paid online by the candidate while registering for the online examination. The payment can be made by Debit Cards/ Credit Cards/ Internet Banking through payment gateway. Candidates are advised to follow the instructions/ steps given on the payment gateway, and also print/ keep transaction details for their records.

- Refund of Multiple Payments. If multiple payments are received from a candidate against single application, then that will be refunded back to the originating account after closing of registration and re-conciliation of all payment records. However, if candidate is found to have filled multiple applications, only one application will be accepted and the amount with respect to other applications not considered for recruitment process will not be refunded. Fee once paid shall not be refunded under any circumstances and shall not be kept in reserve for any other examination or selection.
- Candidate must have his valid E-mail ID and Mobile No. for successful online registration.
- Candidate should enter AADHAAR number in online application. Candidates from J&K, Ladakh, Assam and Meghalaya are exempted for the same, if not having AADHAAR card
- Candidates are to reach at the Examination Centre with colour print out of provisional Admit Card. Candidates shall be debarred from appearing in the online test in case anomalies/ irregularities/ incorrect information are observed during initial verification at the examination venue or at any subsequent stage of selection process.
- The candidates should carry his AADHAAR Card (as displayed on their Admit Card) as proof of identity whenever they report for the Selection Test (Phase-I & II) and Medical Test. Candidates from J&K, Ladakh, Assam and Meghalaya are to carry any other valid ID Proof, if not having AADHAAR
